Oaktree is an Australian-based youth-led organisation dedicated to empowering young people across the Asia-Pacific region to transform their local communities.

We believe in building an equitable, just, and sustainable world by resourcing youth-led initiatives, amplifying diverse youth voices, and shifting perceptions within the international development sector.



WHO WE ARE

Oaktree is a youth-led organisation dedicated to empowering young people across the Asia-Pacific region to transform their local communities. We believe in building an equitable, just, and sustainable world by resourcing youth-led initiatives, amplifying diverse youth voices, and shifting perceptions within the international development sector.

We exist to ensure all young people have the opportunity to become agents of change, addressing local challenges and contributing to global discussions on policy and practice.

Founded in 2003 by a group of determined young Australians, Oaktree emerged as a beacon of youthdriven change in international development. What began as a grassroots movement has blossomed into a dynamic force for global impact.

In our early years, we hit the ground running with hands-on projects in South Africa and Timor-Leste, focusing on HIV education and school construction. Our ambition soared in 2007 with the Zero Seven Roadtrip, mobilising 700 youth ambassadors across Australia to advocate for increased foreign aid – a campaign that successfully influenced government policy. The 2010s saw Oaktree expanding its reach and refining its approach. We empowered youth in East Timor to resolve conflicts, revolutionised education in Cambodia, and tackled unemployment in Papua New Guinea. Simultaneously, we amplified youth voices in policy discussions, submitting proposals to the government and creating policy guides for INGOs.

Today, Oaktree stands at the forefront of youth-led international development. Our youth-to-youth solidarity initiative, the Oaktree Youth Solidarity Fund, supports youth-led organisations across the Asia-Pacific region. From promoting digital literacy in Timor-Leste to addressing environmental issues in Indonesia, we're catalysing change through local youth leadership.

Our advocacy has evolved to champion youth rights on the global stage, pushing for stronger protections and greater youth participation in decision-making processes. At our core, we believe that young people are not just future leaders, but today's essential changemakers.

As we look to the future, Oaktree remains committed to our founding vision: creating a more just world by empowering young people to lead the charge. This strategic plan outlines our roadmap for continuing this vital mission, building on our rich history to forge an even more impactful and sustainable future.


- Redefining Oaktree's role within the OYSF 1.

Ensuring Oaktree is Financially and Operationally Stable

<u>Activity</u>

Evidence translation

<u>Strategy</u>

Stabilising and growing our core operational model is essential for Oaktree's sustainability. Our funding is intrinsically tied to the value that key decision makers in international development place on the priorities of young people. Due to our flexible funding model, Oaktree is unable to access funding from more traditional sources, such as the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT), and must seek alternative arrangements. For this reason, we will:

- 1. Regularly engage with the sector on the value of untied and decolonised funding
- 2. Advocate for and secure investments in young people
- 3. Demonstrate the impact of youth-led movements

By increasing understanding of youth-led initiatives like ours, we aim to pave the way for diverse funding sources for youth-led movements across the sector.
